M.I.S.S. - MY INTERN(ATION)AL SPACE STATION

With their new performance project M.I.S.S. – My Intern(ation)al Space Station Stephanie Winter and SALON HYBRID make their way into the orbit of the imaginary White Planet. Together with the audience they explore this fictive planet on a theoretical as well as performative level.

The White Planet is not only located in outer space, but also becomes manifest in the mind of its observers. It is a kind of primal singularity, origin, source and storage of all information, collective memory, common organ. It is also a projection screen for different concepts, ideas and visions for our future.

The White Planet has not yet been explored from close proximity. Only the M.I.S.S. Corporation was able to develop a technique to proceed into its surrounding area. Now it has dispatched M.I.S.S. – My Intern(ation)al Space Station into the orbit of the White Planet. There the impact and influence of this imaginary celestial object on the humans is examined under particular conditions.

The route to M.I.S.S. is a well-kept secret. The journey starts in a bar in the district of Meidling in Vienna. After the check-in at the reception the probands are picked up and taken to the transfer station to be transported into the mental orbit in a specially constructed capsule. Having arrived at the M.I.S.S., the probands connect with the White Planet through different physical exercises and thought experiments, while the crew leads them into their own universe.

SALON HYBRID / PARAPRAXIS

M.I.S.S. – My Intern(ation)al Space Station is the next version of the project series PARAPRAXIS by Stephanie Winter and Salon Hybrid. Playing with SciFi-aesthetics, M.I.S.S. changes between performative parcour, walk-on film set and experimental laboratory.

SALON HYBRID is a bureau for experimental and performative matters. Since 2013 SALON HYBRID stages the series of performative installations called PARAPRAXIS in vacant buildings and unusual locations. The term PARAPRAXIS can not only be read as an error or Freudian slip of the tongue, but also as a practice that negotiates themes between art and science in an idiosyncratic parallel world — a simulacrum. The PARAPRAXIS format allows SALON HYBRID to combine issues and ideas relating to content, theory, as well as aesthetics in various experiments, to try things out in a more immediate way and to keep them moving

PARAPRAXIS works as a kind of memory or memory machinery, which is only set in motion with the audience's entrance. Dressed in parapractical work clothes, the audience meets itself and the performers in a scenic parcours. SALON HYBRID develops comprehensive worlds that follow a strict internal logic of their own. Within the framework of these staged settings, we return agency to the (lay) performers and visitors. In so doing, SALON HYBRID is particularly interested in the relationship between control and contradiction. A key aspect of this approach is to incorporate errors, attitudes, or coincidences into the system as possibilities and to reflect on them, in order to use them deliberately later.

STEPHANIE WINTER

Stephanie Winter studied Painting & Post-Conceptual Art Practices at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna (Gunter Damisch, Marina Grzinic) and the Berlin University of Arts (Daniel Richter) from 2001 – 2007. Her thesis project, the 12-piece installation *Paternoster*, won the prize of the Academy in 2007. Her short film Der Doppelgänger was premiered at the Diagonale in Graz in 2009 and won the Excellence Award of the International Short Film Festival Busan / South Korea in 2010. In 2011 and 2012 she received a scholarship by the City of Bonn. Together with SALON HYBRID, she launched the series of performative installations PARAPRAXIS in 2012. In 2014 she obtained the Fine Art Talent Award of the City of Vienna and in the winter of 2014/15 she was artist in residence at the Cité des Arts in Paris, supported by the Province of Salzburg. Her short film Tristes Deserts – A Robot's Tale was premiered at the Hong Kong Film Festival in 2015 and was awarded as best national music video at the Vienna Independent Shorts Festival. In 2016, together with SALON HYBRID she stages the fifth version of the PARAPRAXIS, M.I.S.S. -INTERN(ATION)AL SPACE STATION, at a former key factory in Vienna. Her films and installations were featured at numerous international festivals and exhibitions, including Short Film Corner Cannes, Berlin Music Video Awards, Salon Européen de Jeunes Créateurs, Women in Revolt London/Berlin, New York Queer Experimental Film Festival, MUMOK Cinema, Rheinisches Landesmuseum Bonn, Altes Pfandhaus Köln, Museumspavillon Salzburg.

The publication *PARAPRAXIS*¹ – *In the Realm of Error* is dedicated to the error as deviation, mistake, contradiction or disruption and its potentials. Since 2013 Stephanie Winter and SALON HYBRID appropriate vacant buildings with the series PARAPRAXIS, meandering between performative installation, walk-in film set and experimental laboratory.
